PMEA announced in its "Early May Update" that renewal forms for the 2016-17 school year will be mailed soon. Our "dues" are just \$64 (PMEA & NAfME) or \$30 (PMEA only). To help support the excellent work our colleagues are doing "in the trenches" throughout Pennsylvania, and retired members' recent projects in particular, you are encouraged to respond quickly. Online renewal is available by logging onto the <u>PMEA</u> website and selecting the join/renew menu option at the top of the page. I would like to see a BIG increase in retired member enrollments. As of March 2016, our numbers are:

Representing another resource for people with "much more free time on their hands," this will join what PMEA retired members have already posted under their section on the PMEA website: directories of community bands, orchestras, and choruses.



This project is challenging! Just because you profess to be a local "civic theater" in Pennsylvania, it does not mean you offer "open" of

"civic theater" in Pennsylvania, it does not mean you offer "open" auditions for non-Equity actors, or seek volunteers to lend a hand making the sets/costumes or running the stage tech (although they all seem to want money or unpaid ushers!). We found some semi-professional companies act very "community" oriented, while others are really "closed shops!" FYI, if I was uncertain about their "amateur" status or opportunities for nonprofessionals, I would include the name of the organization... to allow our members to find out for themselves if the association would accept non-union actors, etc.

Another problem is that many small theatre groups do not maintain a webpage. We know we are probably missing scores of amateur drama companies. Can you help?
