# On the political scene... and how to make your voice count!



Mark Despotakis, State Chair of the PMEA Advancement of Music Education Council, sent out a "PMEA advocacy action alert" with information about the status of the PA state budget, the "fair funding formula" enacted in H.B. 1552, and the creation of a Pennsylvania Council on Jazz under S.B. 1234. Mark says it is critical that WE share our viewpoints... the more individual responses from taxpayers, the better:

Your voice is extremely important in getting a budget enacted that will include an increase in funding to the basic education subsidy.
