Day of Giving

On Tuesday, December 1, 2015, charities, families, businesses, community centers, and students around the world will come together for one common purpose: to celebrate generosity and to give."

"It's a simple idea. Just find a way for your family, your community, your company, or your organization to come together to give something more. Then tell everyone you can about how you are giving. Join us and be a part of a global celebration of a new tradition of generosity."

PMEA has announced several philanthropic opportunities to support and enhance music education programs and recognition awards throughout the Commonwealth. Go to the state website, and click on the links under "Resources" and "Scholarships and Awards." Here are segments of this information from www.pmea.net:

Honorary Membership and Honorary Life Membership: Members of 25 years or more are recommended by individual districts and then sent to the state executive board for approval. The state board may approve one application per year

Irene R. Christman Scholarship: The scholarship is presented to an outstanding All State student who will be attending college to major in music education. Applications are available online; deadline in March (varies depending on dates of Annual In-Service Conference/All State. Established in 1997

James R. Stewart Distinguished Service Award: Award given to someone who has served PMEA at the State Level. Other criteria may include length of service, multiple PMEA state level offices, NAFME Eastern Division, and/or National Offices. Named for James R. Stewart, past PMEA State President.

Margaret S. Bauer Grant Program: To provide grants to qualifying PMEA members who require funding for professional development, resources, equipment, or creative projects which will enhance music instruction, student learning and forward the mission of PMEA



PMEA Jazz Scholarship: Money was given to PMEA by the PA unit of IAJE to be used for scholarships for Jazz students. It was agreed that a \$1000.00 scholarship would be given each year to a student in an All State Jazz Ensemble (Instrumental or Vocal).

PMEA Hall of Fame: Established July 2008 to honor music educators who, by virtue of their contributions, are recognized as being the most highly regarded professional leaders in music education in the state of Pennsylvania.

Outstanding Young Music Educator: Award created to honor an outstanding young music educator within their first 3-5 years of teaching for their contributions to music education and PMEA.

PMEA Outstanding Superintendent Award: To honor a superintendent in Pennsylvania that has supported music education in his/her school district

PMEA Citation of Excellence Recipients: On a four-year rotation among the categories of elementary, middle/junior high, high school, and any level (college included), the Citation of Excellence award recipients have made lasting contributions in their area of teaching.

Besides consideration to make a financial contribution to one or more of the scholarship endowments (Irene Christman, Jazz, and Margaret Bauer Grant programs), it behooves us to "put our mouth where our money is" (my adaptation) and nominate candidates for each recognition, all but the final three with an approaching deadline of December 1.

The general guidelines for each award/scholarship are listed when each link is selected. However, nominators will need to sign up for a submittable account (will only take a minute) in order to complete the application, as this program will allow you to save the application and access it at a later time.
