EVALUATION AREAS - PERCUSSION

TECHNIQUE

KEY CRITERIA Rolls (Mallet & Timpani); Rudiments; Articulation; Facility; Flexibility; Control, Tone impacted by Method/Approach and Stick/Mallet Choice; As specific to the instrument

ADDITIONAL FACTORS: Precision; Consistency; Facility as the ease of execution of technical passages; Flexibility as the ease of physical maneuverability, especially throughout the range of the mallet instrument and between timpani; Control overall, including of any sticks or mallets; Sticking; Dexterity; Coordination; Mechanical Skill; Left-right equity; Smoothness; Finesse; Method or approach to generating characteristic timbre; TIMPANI: Dampening and pedaling; Method or approach to all aspects of technique as applied to the given percussion instrument;

RHYTHM

KEY CRITERIA | Accuracy; Subdivision; Meter; Articulation as impacting Rhythm; Control

ADDITIONAL FACTORS: Patterns that include rests, ties, dotted notes and syncopation; Releases; Articulation—accents and legato--- as impacting rhythm; Consistency of approach

MUSICIANSHIP

KEY CRITERIA Tempo Changes; Dynamics; Phrasing; Style; Expression, Nuance & Artistry

ADDITIONAL FACTORS: Tempo – changes, range and contrast; Dynamics – levels, changes, range and contrast; Phrasing, phrase shaping, and overall linear contouring within a feel for the musical line; Style in terms of performance practice and historical context; Articulation implied by the style; Realization of the composer's aesthetic intent; Generating musical effect; Conveying emotion; Communication; Musicality; Nuance and artistic subtleties; Artistry; Sensitivity; Feelingfulness

PULSE

KEY CRITERIA | Accuracy; Stability; Control; Recovery

ADDITIONAL FACTORS: Consistency throughout range of tempi, dynamic levels, dynamic changes and technical demands; overall command of time regardless of stye

ROLLS or NOTES/TUNING or TONE

KEY CRITERIA | Accuracy; Control; Precision, Consistency; Releases, As specific to the instrument

ADDITIONAL FACTORS: NOTES: overall and within the context of key signatures, key changes and accidentals outside of the key; Characteristic timbre, control and consistency throughout range of pitches and dynamics; TIMPANI: Intonation of individual pitches, intervals and parts of chords; Tonality awareness; Adjustments; Pedaling as applied to notes/changing notes and pitch accuracy; TONE: Quality of tone generated through method and approach to generating characteristic timbre
