PMEA Instrumental Focus Group Discussion

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MINDSET

- Think about things as building from ground zero rather that we've always done before!
- How do we connect with audiences/parents and community
- It's about concepts, not concerts
 - Still focus on technique, but not worry about how far along they are for a performance
- Music teachers much maintain self-care and mental/emotional health

Ensemble Modifications

- Physical Distancing
 - Availability of other spaces for rehearsals gyms, auditoriums, etc.
 - What can be repurposed? (Stage)
 - Outdoor spaces (check school guidelines)
 - Small group lessons if weather is cooperative
 - Sectionals in larger spaces ability to walk around
 - Auditorium could become socially-distanced holding area
 - ABA Guidelines bullet points for classroom use and sanitization
 - PMEA not necessarily reinvent guidelines
 - Can masks be lowered during rehearsals? YES (from PDE) if they are socially distanced
 - Strings may not have to be as socially distanced as much if they wear masks? Focus more space for winds?
 - Still need to focus on social distancing!
 - We're in this together!!
 - Spit buckets one for each brass student
 - Taping off a 6x6 area on floor
 - Keep cases in rehearsal room to avoid crowding storage rooms
 - Consider entrance into the rehearsal space to minimize crowds
 - Flipped classroom model all other activities except playing instruments happen in the lesson and then actually play at home send Flipgrid videos for assessment/feedback
 - Smaller ensembles/Chamber Music

Staffing/Scheduling

- Modify teacher schedules to allow for use of other spaces
- Use of student leaders to assist with overseeing spaces
 - Possibly running sectionals?
- Possibly need hall monitors/additional staffing/volunteers to oversee spaces
- Performance considerations (Concerts)
 - Stream Concerts YouTube Live
 - Copyright Issues! Ensure proper licensing!!
 - Teach students how to use the technology

- And parents as much as possible
- Prepare students to play along with a click-track with headphones while in person
 - SmartMusic
- Modified Start to School Hybrid
 - Teaching live and also streaming video

Recruiting Beginners

- Digital documents with demonstrations and forms
- Google Website with all of the introduction information and videos from teachers as well as student testimonials and demonstrations
- Parent Zoom Meetings in Spring and Summer
- Be Part of the Music Website (Scott Lang)
- Looking for guidance for recruiting and retention (PADESTA, ASTA, PMEA)
- How to have students try instruments
 - Students bring a dime/penny, pen, etc. from home
 - Students clap or read rhythms, etc.
 - Buzzing
- Many videos that are already produced for students to watch online
 - Teacher can produce videos for first lessons
 - Suzuki or for beginners be sure to have parents oversee (asynchronous)
- o May need to provide school-owned instruments for more students if possible

Concerns

- One-on-One video lessons Liability?
- Copyright for live streaming
- Burnout!!
- Not providing prep time for other teachers
- Student access to technology/online learning
 - Computers
 - Internet
- Music as enrichment low student participation
- Social distancing in stands for Marching Bands
- Review documents from PDE/PIAA regarding sports
 - No spectators at events only teams, coaches, essential staff
 - Marching Bands allowed to be there or perform
- Budget concerns staffing, technology, equipment, etc.
- Family budgets for instrument rental

Recommendations NOW

- o Gather concerns/questions from all music teachers and share with admin
- Talk about repurposing spaces for rehearsals/classes
- Communicate with parents now (Zoom meetings)\
- Discuss with Admin about importance of classes for those subjects that must be done in person (art, music, phys ed)
- Keep in touch with alumni!
- Need to help public understand how things are different now

- Live experience vs. online learning
- PMEA Webinar idea Complying with Copyright & How to Obtain Licensing for Live Streaming performances
 - Finding funding may be an issue
 - Easier if you do not charge for concerts
 - Archive or One-Time Watch different licenses

 - can be a slideshow with audio.
- o Resources for chamber music/repertoire flex band arrangements, etc.
- Platforms if we're still closed in the Fall
 - Google Classroom

 - Seesaw for primary grades
 - o Blackboard maybe not the best
