Two New PMEA Scholarships for Reimbursement of College Expenses

At PMEA Council TTRR meetings, a frequent topic of discussion is the challenge of affording a college education – rising costs of testing, clearances, mileage to/from field experiences, upgraded instruments, and of course the "super-biggie" expenses of tuition, housing, and meals. Although only a small fraction of a possible remedy, two new significant (~\$5K-\$15K) financial aid resources have been launched by PMEA in the 2023-24 year for currently enrolled college students in their Freshman through Graduate year: *Council TTRR Continuing Education Award* (music-ed majors) & *Music-for-Lifelong-Learning Award* (STEM majors in music).

Now is the time to prepare for the application process, including assembling a portfolio, writing an essay, updating the resume, and recording a solo performance excerpt for "blind judging" by PMEA officers, staff, Council for TTRR members, etc. Of special note to PCMEA members: To be eligible for consideration, you

must have attended a PMEA-sponsored professional development program. (See the many options in this newsletter!)



First the timeline (left). The Stark-Fox Family Fund Scholarship forms will go "live" beginning April 1, 2023. Application and all supportive documentation will be due on or before June 1, 2023. The award winners will be announced in July 2023. Scholarship recipients should collect their college expense receipts during the Fall 2023 and Spring 2024 semesters and send copies of them in a single mailing to the PMEA office on or before June 1, 2024.




