EVALUATION AREA	ATTRIBUTES TO CONSIDER FOR ASSESSMENT AND AS TALKING POINTS FOR ORAL & WRITTEN COMMENTS
TONE	Quality; Clarity; Focus; Projection; Maturity; Naturalness; Method or approach to generating characteristic timbre; Posture, body and hand positions impacting tone quality; Characteristic timbre, control and consistency throughout range of pitches and dynamics; Resonance; Head tension; Tuning; TIMPANI - Intonation of individual pitches, intervals and parts of chords; Tonality awareness; Adjustments; Blend and Balance with accompaniment
ACCURACY	Notes overall and within the context of key signatures, key changes and accidentals outside of the key; Rhythms including subdivision and patterns that include rests, ties, dotted notes and syncopation; Pulse stability; Correctness of meters; Attacks and releases; Articulation— accents and legato; Consistency of approach; Alignment with accompaniment
TECHNIQUE	Method or approach to all aspects of technique as applied to the given percussion instrument; Facility as the ease of execution of technical passages; Flexibility as the ease of maneuverability; Control overall, including of any sticks or mallets; Sticking; Rudiments; Rolls; Dexterity; Coordination; Mechanical Skill; Left-right equity; Smoothness; Finesse; Dampening; Pedaling;
INTERPRETATION	Tempo – stability, changes, range and contrast; Dynamics – levels, changes, range and contrast; Phrasing, phrase shaping and contouring; Style in terms of performance practice and historical context; Articulation implied by the style
EXPRESSION	Generating musical effect; Conveying emotion; Communication; Musicality; Feel for musical line; Musicality of direction and form; Realization of the composer's aesthetic intent; Nuance and artistic subtleties; Artistry; Sensitivity; Feelingfulness
