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INTRODUCTION

HOW THE NEW SML WILL BE IMPLEMENTED IN 2024

The Draft PMEA Selective Music List (SML) for Mixed Chorus has been revised and is ready for implementation in 2024 at PMEA Music Performance Assessments (MPA's).

Directors are strongly recommended to select their music for this year's MPA's from this list at the grade levels designated. However, given that this is a Draft of the new list pending approval in summer 2024 and that directors likely already selected music for this school year's MPA, music not currently on the list may be submitted for approval as in the past. This draft document can serve as a resource for repertoire selection moving forward.

Complete and submit the 'Selective Music List Requests' online form to request these approvals and ask other common questions concerning repertoire to perform at an MPA, especially those that will continue to emerge in future seasons while implementing a newly revised list. Those questions will likely include, but not be limited to, the following:

- Permission to perform a piece not currently on the Selective Music List. Pieces submitted will be considered for approval and assigned a PMEA Grade Level.
- Permission to perform fewer selections within a collection or fewer movements of a multi-movement piece at a lower grade level instead of the entire piece at the grade level listed. This opportunity expands flexibility for ensembles to perform one or more selections or movements at a lower grade level to expose more students to an amount of music that they might not be able to perform in its entirety at that time.
- Permission to perform other selections within a collection or movements of a given piece than currently listed. The listing for some pieces already indicates specific selections or movements to be performed at a designated grade level. Directors may propose changing the movements involved and the resulting grade level.
- Request to change the current grade level assigned to a given piece. Directors may propose that a given piece be reviewed for possible reclassification at a different grade level, lower or higher.

An ongoing goal will be to identify review the pieces and collections to determine what ensembles can realistically prepare and perform at an appropriate grade level in the MPA setting. This initial compilation includes larger works or collections with an extremely wide range among the source lists concerning what choruses are required to perform for an MPA. Enabling more pieces to be more accessible by more students is a feature of quality lists that we feel should also be a priority in Pennsylvania. We encourage directors to propose options to help shape what works best for Pennsylvania choruses today and moving forward.

Another ongoing goal is for each listing to be complete and accurate in spelling, including first and last names of composers and arrangers, publishers involved, voicing(s), accompaniment or a cappella, other instruments or accompaniment options, and language. The source lists varied widely in what was included.

Please contact me with any corrections needed in content, spelling or to complete any missing aspect of a given listing as well as if a piece is now 'OOP/'Out of Print' or available only by 'Rental' or 'POD/Print on Demand'.

A quality Selective Music List is one that is always an active 'work in progress', continuously evolving to reflect additions from previously published and new repertoire, refinements in number of movements from a larger work or selections from a collection that are required, additional listings with options to perform few or different components at a lower grade level, adjustments to assigned grade levels, and ongoing, routine corrections for accuracy.

HOW THE CHORUS SML WAS REVISED

The existing PMEA Selective Music Lists for Band, Orchestra and Chorus were last revised in 1991. Developing the new PMEA Selective Music Lists included the following steps:

- Researched existing state and other recognized lists
- Set aside the existing PMEA SML from 1991 for now to use as a reference and started fresh to develop a new list
- Identified seven high quality selective music lists for Chorus to use as primary source documents: Iowa, Kansas, North Carolina, New York, the Teaching Music Through Performance series, Texas, and Virginia
- Acquired the most recent list available from each source
- Developed an Excel spreadsheet layout and then converted or typed each of the seven source lists along with the pieces submitted by PA directors since 2004 and approved by Dr. Tad Greig from Westminster College for use at PMEA MPA's into a single document to create one master compilation of 7,908 listed titles
- Standardized the data entry formatting and proofed for spelling
- Distilled the master compilation into a format listing each individual title and the rating that each piece received, if any, within each of the 7 source lists and from PMEA
- Determined an initial, official PMEA Rating for each title derived from the ratings each received, if any, within the seven source lists and PMEA, taking into consideration that grade level assignments are not standardized among lists or by publishers. Grading criteria is mostly unavailable.

The official PMEA Selective Music List (SML) for Mixed Chorus will be continuously provided as an Excel spreadsheet for maximum director flexibility in sorting and searching. We recommend perusing the list from different perspectives as sorted By Title, By Composer, By Grade and then by Title, and, By Grade and then by Composer.

This initial 2024 compilation for Mixed Chorus includes **5,485** titles that are divided into six Grade Levels as follows:

Grade 1 – 276	Grade 4 – 1,513
Grade 2 – 812	Grade 5 – 1,020
Grade 3 – 1,430	Grade 6 – 434

Each of these initial 5,485 titles were included on the following number of Source Lists:

4 Source Lists - 130

Subsequent steps planned concerning the PMEA SML for Mixed Chorus that have not already been mentioned include, but are not limited to, the following:

- To research and establish official PMEA criteria for assigning Grade Levels 1-6 to Mixed Chorus repertoire
- To develop a formal review process by a 'Chorus Repertoire Review Committee' to determine if submitted pieces should be approved to be added to the PMEA SML for Mixed Chorus and, if so, at what Grade Level.
- To review the last formal edition of the PMEA SML for Chorus in 1991 to determine if any pieces included that are not on the new PMEA SML for Mixed Chorus should be reinstated.
- To establish a network for borrowing a piece that is out of print from existing libraries throughout the state
- To identify which of the titles included in the PMEA SML for Mixed Chorus are indeed 'masterworks' or 'core repertoire' as an additional resource for new and veteran directors alike
